

SUNSHINE COAST FC ACADEMY

TERMS OF ENROLMENT

The following terms will have been deemed to have been agreed between Sunshine Coast FC (SCFC) and the Applicant upon application being made to enrol in the Academy:

FEES

The fee for the Academy for term 3, 2013 onwards will be \$270.00 (inc. GST);

The fee for the Academy clothing kit for term 3, 2013 onwards will be \$40.00 (inc. GST);

Payment Terms:

SCFC will render an account at the commencement of each term during which a child is enrolled in the Academy. Seven days shall be allowed for payment of the fees charged. If payment is not received within seven days, SCFC reserves the right to do any or all of the following:

Charge a late payment fee of \$15.00 per fortnight

Withhold or refuse delivery of any clothing ordered until payment is made

Cancel the enrolment of the child

CLOTHING

The clothing supplied in the kit shall be:

One Academy shirt

One pair of Academy shorts

One pair of socks

Other clothing may be purchased from our merchandise range. Orders must be placed with SCFC administration staff and not through coaching staff;

To ensure that sizing is accurate, player's parent/guardian will be required to complete a sizing form. The form must be returned to the administration office with the payment due prior to the order being made or provided (if clothing is in stock);

SCFC reserves the right to substitute the type and/or brand of clothing with a type and/or brand of similar quality should there be any unavailability of product from the Club's normal suppliers. The selection of a substitute supplier shall be solely at the discretion of SCFC;

In term 3, 2013, SCFC intends to supply to new entrants in the Academy, Adidas branded clothing;

SESSIONS

Academy sessions will be conducted twice weekly with sessions being of 90 minutes duration; The venue for the Academy will be notified at the beginning of the term; SCFC reserves the right to vary session times and venues should unforeseen circumstances arise;

SESSION CANCELLATIONS

If a session is cancelled by SCFC due to adverse weather, field closure or staff illness, a make up session will be organised;

A time/venue for the make up session will be advised with a minimum of seven days' notice;

Should an Academy participant not attend any session due to any other reason a credit for the session will not be provided;

Parents/guardians should consider if they wish to have their child participate in the Academy in any particular term if they anticipate a significant number of absences due to other commitments or unavailability;

If exceptional circumstances exist, SCFC, at its sole discretion, may consider a request for fee remission. Full supporting circumstances will be required to be provided.

INSURANCE

SCFC currently holds public liability indemnity insurance through Football Queensland. Please note that this insurance does not provide player insurance except for public liability matters;

Parents/guardians should ensure that they have in place appropriate medical insurance to cover medical expenses not covered by Medicare;

If parents/guardians are not permanent residents of Australia and are not covered by a reciprocal health insurance arrangement they should ensure they retain private health insurance;

SCFC does not, and will not, accept responsibility for accidental injury that may occur to a player as a consequence of playing or training at the SCFC Academy;

POINTS OF CONTACT

If you have any issues you wish to raise concerning your child's participation in the Academy you should, in the first instance, raise them with the Academy Director, Ben Cahn. VARIATION OF TERMS OF ENROLMENT

SCFC does not provide authority to any person, whether employed by SCFC or not, to vary these terms of enrolment;

Any variation of these terms must be in writing and under the specific authorisation of the Managing Director or his/her nominated delegate;

CHILD PROTECTION LEGISLATION

SCFC actively works to comply with current child protection legislation. All staff and volunteers are required to hold accreditation with relevant Government agencies. No person is authorised to conduct or undertake responsibility for management of children participating at the Academy who do not hold the requisite accreditation.

CODE OF CONDUCT

SCFC has adopted the FFA Spectators Code of Conduct and expects all parents/guardians to comply with the Code. Failure to comply could result in a person being immediately expelled from an SCFC organised event or program, and, if serious enough, permanently banned from attending any SCFC organised event or program.

ACADEMY OBJECTIVES

SCFC conducts a junior Academy principally for two reasons, one being to improve player's performance and the other to identify players for selection in its National Premier Leagues (NPL) teams;

The enrolment of a player in the Academy does not provide a guarantee that a player will be selected for an NPL team. Selection of NPL players is based on talent, ability and commitment. SCFC coaches will always look first to the SCFC Academy to find sufficient players displaying the talent, ability and commitment to fill SCFC's NPL teams. If, in the view of the SCFC coaching staff, sufficient players with the requisite attributes do not exist within the Academy, they reserve the right to look to introduce players from outside of the Academy;

DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Should any dispute arise concerning these terms or involving the participation of a child in the SCFC Academy, the parties to the dispute will undertake to exercise goodwill in attempting to promptly resolve the dispute. Neither party will seek to disparage the other;

If a resolution to the dispute cannot be achieved between the parties, the parties agree, in the first instance, to utilise the Football Queensland grievance resolution process. The parties agree to utilise the process and participate in a constructive manner. If that process should fail to achieve a resolution the matter may then revert to other rights at law.
