NPL ladder positions:

Here are the Fire teams' positions on the ladders. Be aware that many of our junior teams have games in hand.

First Team: fourth on the ladder with 43 goals for, 10 against and 21 points.

U18 Boys: second on the ladder with 36 goals for, 23 against and 28 points.

U18 Girls: second on the ladder with 36 goals for, 12 against and 27 points.

Under 16 Boys: eighth on the ladder with 26 goals for, 23 against and nine points.

Under 15 Boys: third on the ladder with 51 goals for, 11 against and 29 points.

Under 14 Boys: fourth on the ladder with 41 goals for, 12 against and 24 points.

Under 14 Girls: First on the ladder with 87 goals for, nine against and 35 points.

Under 13 Boys: fifth on the ladder with 29 goals for, 20 against and 17 points.
