Scholarship opportunity for young Fire footballers

Sunshine Coast FC, in partnership with Peregian Beach College, is pleased to announce the new Elite Player Scholarship program, to provide young footballers with the unique opportunity to gain quality football development along with quality education.

Managing Director Noel Woodall announced the new program on Thursday, August 1, and said it was designed to offer the best opportunities for gifted young footballers both academically and on the field.

"At Sunshine Coast FC, we want to provide an opportunity for young players in terms of football development, however we also understand the importance of education," Mr Woodall said.

"If we can provide quality education and quality football development, we can give deserving young players on the Sunshine Coast a chance of real success."

The scholarship program will provide successful

applicants with payment of tuition fees at Peregian Beach College, and for participation in a Sunshine Coast FC elite team competing in the National Premier Leagues. The initial time-frame for the scholarships is two to three years, with the possibility of extension if players should continue to meet scholarship standards.

The value of the scholarships awarded could reach in the order of \$500,000 in the first two years of operation.

Footballers aged 12 to 16, in school years seven through to 11 are encouraged to apply for the Elite Player Scholarships. The scholarships will commence in the 2014 academic year and football season. Both boys and girls are eligible to apply for the Scholarships and further details can be obtained by emailing an expression of interest to admin@sunshinecoastfc.com.au by September 30.

Fire Under 18 Boys win the Premiership

After a season of challenges, the Fire Under 18 Boys secured the inaugural NPL U18s Premiership in a tense match against in-form SWQ Thunder.

Coach Paul Arnison kept preparation for the match lowkey so as to minimise the pressure on the team, but said the boys had a few nerves at the start of the game.

"The tension showed in our game (during the first half) ... we kept missing chance after chance, picking the wrong option – I think it was nerves and the importance of the game."

The Fire went in to half-time drawing nil all, and Arnison knew the half-time team talk would play an important role in calming the nerves.

"I told them, 'we just need to keep passing the ball simply and move. Once we get one goal we know we will get four or five.""

The Fire returned to the pitch with conviction and Captain Steven Lawrance soon opened the scoring with a great solo effort; he picked up the ball at the half way line and drove forward to beat five defenders and slot in a goal.

"You could see how much that goal meant to the boys, they started to relax into the game," Arnison said.

The Fire soon doubled its tally as Brandon Lee put home a 'wonder' goal, picking up the ball on the left-hand corner of the box, beating two players and rocketing a shot to bend past a defender and the goalkeeper into the top corner of the net.

Josh Ives beat the Thunder defenders to score from a tight angle, giving the Fire a comfortable 3-0 lead.

'Goal machine' Aiden Little sealed he Fire's win after some great work on the wing from Ryan McMaster.

Arnison said he could not be more proud of the hard work his team had put in throughout the season, including those players who had left earlier in the season; Jack Johnson, Luke Maclean and Elliot Marsay (who will be returning for the finals).

Sunshine Coast FC Technical Director Kevin A'herne Evans said securing the Premiership was a great achievement.

"This team has worked through challenges throughout the season, and winning the Premiership has been a reward for all the effort they have put in," he said.

"Coach Paul Arnison and the players can be extremely proud of the dedication they have shown in their first season."

The Under 18s will now continue training ahead of the finals.
